Making our homes fit for the future

Tackling the UK's inefficient and draughty houses is one of the biggest challenges on the road to net zero, requiring a national strategy, local leadership, and engagement from all of us. The pandemic has reminded us of the importance of home and having a safe, comfortable space – how can we build back better, with warmer and more efficient homes that have lower bills, are better for our health and lead to sustainable jobs in the supply chain?

This discussion explored how we move from the 'stop start policies' of the past to build momentum and scale with a thriving, consistent market for installers and the low carbon supply chain.

Unlocking the investment to build back greener

The government's commitment to 'Build Back Greener' will require billions of pounds of investment flows to be redirected from high carbon sectors to sustainable and resilient assets, such as renewable power generation, decarbonising our homes and electric vehicle charging.

With the Prime Minister's announcement of the "ten point plan for a green industrial revolution", including commitments on green finance, this session heard from leading investors on how we unlock investment into the zero carbon infrastructure of the future.
